Graduated from University of Maryland School of Law in 1982 and with a degree in economics with distinction from the University of Virginia in 1978.

**Jeannie E. Cho** First Asian-American judge appointed to the Circuit Court bench in Montgomery County. Previously served as District Court Judge, a prosecutor, and in private practice. Born in South Korea, she graduated with a BA from the University of Maryland and a Juris Doctorate from Loyola University of Chicago School of Law. Has received numerous awards for community service, including Maryland Citizen Award, The League of Korean Americans of Maryland and Maryland's Top 100 Women.

**Jill Reid Cummins** Extensive litigation and trial experience in State and Federal Courts in Maryland and DC. Managing Attorney for Allstate Insurance Company's Capital Region for 13 years. Montgomery County resident for more than 48 years. Graduate of University of Virginia, American University and Washington College of Law. Active in the Street Law program for local high school students throughout the Metropolitan area and assists with voter registration and training.

**Debra L. Dwyer** Appointed to Circuit Court bench in 2016. Served as Deputy Chief at the U.S. Department of Justice's Organized Crime and Gang Section and Montgomery County State's Attorney's Office as Assistant State's Attorney. Served as Assistant U.S. Attorney in Baltimore, prosecuting violent crimes including large drug distribution operations, and received the DOJ's Director's Award for several high-profile prosecutions. Life-long resident of Montgomery County. Received her undergraduate degree, master's degree and law degree from American University.

**Lockbox for Education Funding  
from Gambling Revenue**

Requires the state to use gambling revenue to supplement pre-K through grade 12 funding by specific, non-transferable amounts.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**  
**Same Day Voter Registration**

Authorizes the General Assembly to enact legislation to allow a qualified individual to register and vote at a precinct polling place on Election Day.

Alters the composition of the Redistricting Commission, which reviews the boundaries of Council Districts, from 9 members to 11 members, includes at least 1, but no more than 4 members of every political party that polls at least 15% of the preceding election and removes party central committees from submitting names for appointment.
